

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. DIFFERENT TYPES OF FIBRES

Sisal, seagrass, wool, and yak hair are all natural fibres. The structure of these flooring materials may therefore be somewhat irregular. Dyed fibres can also show slight variations in shade. This means that rugs delivered at different times may display slight colour differences. They are also sensitive to changes in temperature and humidity.

Sisal is a fibre extracted from the leaves of a type of agave plant; it shrinks in high humidity and expands in a dry indoor climate. Seagrass, unlike sisal, expands in high humidity.

Wool, yak, polyamide, polyester, and PET fibres do not experience noticeable changes due to moisture or water.

Polyamide, polyester, and PET are synthetic fibres characterised by being lint-free and easy to dye, resulting in vibrant colours. The selection of colours is also broader compared to rugs made from natural fibres. Our synthetic fibre qualities are also durable, easy to wash, and keep clean. Over time, rugs made from polyamide, polyester, and PET may lose some of their sheen, but rotating the rug can help balance this effect.

Dyed rugs are never completely colourfast, so it's best to avoid direct sunlight as much as possible. Intense stain removal efforts can also cause colour changes. More information on stains can be found under Stain Removal in the care instructions.

It is generally accepted that natural fibre coverings may exhibit "bowing," meaning that certain stripes form an arc. This can result in the edge band not following the rug's pattern or the rug not being completely rectangular.

2. BORDERS

Our range includes high-quality borders with thicknesses that usually prevent the rug's structure from showing through the border. The borders also have double edges that significantly extend their lifespan.

We also offer borders with our own DURALUX suede imitation and ELMO leather. Both of these borders share an exclusive appearance and are less prone to soiling than cotton or linen borders. They can also be easily wiped clean if dirty.

To edge with leather, we cut strips from hides and sew them together to form a border. This results in a relatively large number of cross-stitches on a carpet with a leather edge. The leather edge is sewn together with a border edge placed on the back. The visible part is approximately 55 mm wide. A wider visible part can be offered upon request.

3. OVERLOCKING

We also offer edging with overlock stitching. Most rugs can be overlocked with our proprietary INVISILOC® overlock, which provides a discreet, almost invisible edge. This option is suitable for rugs in both commercial and domestic areas. Additionally, we have several traditional overlock options made from synthetic and natural materials.

4. CHOOSING A RUG

With a wide selection of rugs and borders in various colours, it can be practical to have a fabric sample, a piece of wallpaper, or something similar on hand to see how the colours match.

It's also important to consider what should be the main visual focus. For instance, if you have a particularly beautiful piece of furniture, you might not want the rug to compete for attention. Conversely, interesting combinations can be created that make the rug the standout feature.

At this stage, consider whether aesthetics or practicality is more important. A lighter rug is more sensitive and will generally show dirt more quickly than a darker or patterned rug.

5. RUG DIMENSIONS, DESIGN, AND THICKNESS

We offer free sizing, meaning you can choose any dimensions. However, we are limited to a maximum width of 4 or 5 meters, depending on the width of the parent roll. No extra costs are incurred for material wastage! However, we offer a special discount on rugs ordered in full width (4 or 5 meters, depending on the parent roll's width).

For technical production reasons, we reserve the right to exceed or fall short of the specified dimensions by 1-2 cm.

Most of our rugs have a width and length orientation. We interpret all orders received such that the first dimension is the width and the second is the length of the rug. We only accept written orders.

Keep in mind that an edged rug increases the rug's thickness by approximately 8–10 mm, which can sometimes cause issues with doors that need to open if the gap between the floor and the door bottom is too narrow.

6. RUG UNDER A DINING TABLE

If the rug is intended to go under a dining table, the size should ideally be at least 60 cm, preferably 75 cm, larger on each side of the table to prevent chairs from catching on the rug's edge when pulled out. Sometimes smaller dimensions must be accepted due to room size limitations.

7. RUG UNDER A SOFA GROUP

A rug for a sofa group can either cover the entire area or part of it. This is a matter of personal preference.

8. HALLWAY RUNNERS

For hallway runners, as with rugs for sofa groups, you can choose the size that feels best. Leave at least 10 cm from the wall so that the floor underneath is visible.

Also, note that a hallway runner without a non-slip backing needs to be secured in some way. This can be done with strong double-sided tape, a double-sided net on the floor, or by applying a water-soluble adhesive solution to part of the rug's underside. The thinner and longer the rug, the more important it is to secure it to the floor.

9. ROUND, ELLIPSE-SHAPED, STADIUM-SHAPED, OR ROUNDED RUGS

This type of rug is delivered at an additional cost due to increased wastage and the extra time required for cutting and sewing.

For edging this type of rug, the visible part of the border can be a maximum of 30 mm, as a wider border may cause the rug to warp.

Note that some of our thinner rugs cannot be made with rounded edges, as cutting these creates tension in the rug.

10. IMPREGNATION

Our rugs can be impregnated before delivery, making it harder for dirt and liquids to penetrate the fibres, which makes stain removal easier. However, we cannot guarantee that all stains will be removed despite this treatment. For stain removal information, see the care instructions.

A wall-to-wall rug can be impregnated immediately after installation. Contact us for more information.

11. INDENTATION MARKS

Textile rugs will almost always develop indentation marks from furniture, which may be bothersome if furniture is rearranged or moved. Some marks will fade over time, while others may remain. If this is a significant concern, choose a harder, smoother rug where furniture will leave less noticeable marks.

Rugs delivered with a broader indentation mark across the entire width will see it fade after a short time.

12. TIPS AND TRICKS

If the rug's corners start to curl up due to "inadvertent kicks," bend the corners in the opposite direction to counteract this.

If the border isn't completely flat upon delivery, lightly mist it with water so the border contracts. Note that very coarse rugs may not have a perfectly flat border.

Sometimes, using an iron on the border or rug surface can help relieve tension and wrinkles.

Avoid placing the edged rug in areas where it is exposed to intense sunlight, as both the rug and its edges may fade.
